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1. Matching key-words with their descriptions (meanings)/pictures.
2. Wordbuilding – in the text / in separate sentences / in a table.

e.g. MEDICAL SPECIALTIES. Create names of specialists or their specialisations.

3. Gap-filling – in the text / in separate sentences.
 - a. Inserting function words
 - b. Inserting only prepositions
4. Guided gap-filling:
 - a. key words to insert given in the box
 - b. key words to insert in the previous exercise (e.g. wordbuilding, reading comprehension)
5. “Hangman” – key words are missing, only some letters given in order to guess the word from the context (this type of task can be used in individual sentences and in a text)
6. Cross out an unnecessary word from the sentence.
7. Odd man out exercises – underline a word which does not suit the rest (a way to present synonyms)

e.g. heartburn pertussis pyrosis acid indigestion



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8. Complete missing parts of fixed expressions on the basis of a text.

e.g.

acquire	nursing	scheduledenvironment

9. Pictures → inserting missing letters in the names of e.g. medical equipment

10. Abbreviations:

- a. explain what they stand for
- b. write nursing orders in full

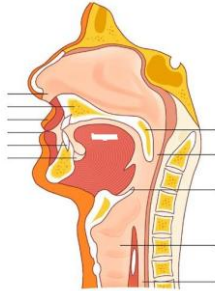
